#### NATURE CAMP LOCATION

Our Nature Camp takes place on the unceded, asserted territory of the Penelakut, Lamalcha, Hwlitsum, other Hul'qumi'num-speaking and SENĆOŦEN-speaking Peoples and on the ceded, asserted territory of the Tsawwassen First Nation.

It is because of the love, respect and stewardship of the land over thousands of years by generations of Coast Salish Peoples that the place we now refer to as "Galiano Island" continues to have abundant wild spaces and a healthy diversity of local flora and fauna to this day.

## OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS

## CAMP AT THE MILLARD LEARNING CENTRE

Sleep under the stars at our quiet and private 188-acre home base, the Millard Learning Centre.

## TRAVEL INFORMATION



Get to Galiano Island easily with BC Ferries. We're a short 1-1.5 hour trip from the Tsawwassen ferry terminal in Vancouver or the Swartz Bay ferry terminal in Victoria.

#### FERRY SCHEDULES & SERVICE NOTICES

Ferries can travel to multiple Gulf Islands within one trip. #### TICKET RESERVATIONS

It is your responsibility for booking and paying for ferry tickets. Reservations can be made for Tsawwassen - Gulf Islands ferry travel but cannot be made for Swartz Bay - Gulf Islands ferry travel.

#### FARES & DISCOUNTS

**Ferry fares are not included in GCA fees.** Students can travel for free between Swartz Bay and Galiano and at a special reduced rate from Tsawwassen to Galiano. Not a student? No problem! Groups over 10 also receive special discounts.

#### STOWED LUGGAGE

Excess luggage can be stowed below deck on the Tsawwassen - Southern Gulf Island route. The luggage cart does not come off the ferry at the Sturdies Bay terminal. Remove your stowed bags from the luggage cart before disembarking.

#### Q: WILL YOU MEET MY CHILD AT THE FERRY?

For a small fee, GCA Staff will chaperone campers on and off the ferry. We will walk on the ferry from Sturdies Bay to Tsawwassen and Swartz Bay, greet you, and accompany you back to Sturdies Bay and make sure you get on our bus safe and sound!



## TRANSPORTATION ON GALIANO

#### GCA SCHOOL BUS

There is no public transportation or taxi service on Galiano Island. You can bring your own vehicle(s) or ride along in the GCA school bus.

Our bus will meet you at the Sturdies Bay ferry terminal on Galiano and bring you to the Millard Learning Centre, where we will set up camp.

## CAMP & REGISTRATION

### WEATHER

Be prepared - camp happens rain or shine! Bring lots of warm layers, sun protection, and extra clothes in case you get wet. In dangerous conditions (high winds) we will stop programming and seek shelter. High winds may result in ferry delays or cancellations. If you are unable to leave Galiano Island due to weather, you will have access to overnight accommodations at the Millard Learning Centre at no additional charge.

### WATER

Please bring a 1L water bottle. The Millard Learning Centre has potable water at the Office and Classroom where you can refill your water bottle throughout the day. We will be doing a lot of hiking, so it is important that you have a large water bottle!

### **FOOD**

Pack a bagged lunch for the first day of camp. The rest is included! We will cook breakfast, lunch and dinners together as a team. Please notify us of any dietary restrictions prior to camp. In addition, we will provide snacks throughout the day (popcorn, granola, smoothies, etc.)

### HIKING DIFFICULTY & ACCESSIBILITY

Most of our days will involve hiking along maintained forest and beach trails that range from easy to difficult in intensity. The Millard Learning Centre's Classroom building and Frontcountry Campground are wheelchair accessible. Please contact us if you are concerned about physical fitness or have mobility limitations so that we can recommend the best field trip for you.

### REGISTRATION INFORMATION

**Register by June 10th.** Camp requires a minimum of 15 campers to operate. If enrollment numbers are low we will notify you on June 11th. A full refund will be issued. Contact the GCA Education staff at bookings@galianoconservancy.ca to register and we will send you all of the required forms and paperwork.





## SAFETY

### **CHAPERONE RATIO**

At least ne GCA education staff member (or volunteer) will be present for every 15 youth in attendance.

### POLICE & VULNERABLE SECTOR CHECKS

All GCA education staff members have completed police and vulnerable sectors checks. We can provide you with a copy of police and vulnerable sectors documents upon request.

## FIRST AID

At least one GCA education staff member facilitating Nature Camp is Wilderness First Aid and CPR-C certified. They will carry a standard first aid kit and a cell phone to communicate with emergency services. We can provide you with a copy of first aidcertifications upon request.

### **EMERGENCIES**

Galiano Island is a remote community with limited access to emergency services. We have one medical clinic (Galiano Healthcare Society), a localambulance service, two volunteer fire departments and a RCMP office.



What happens if my child/student gets hurt or sick during Camp? If your injury or illness is beyond GCA staff's scope of care, we will refer you to the Galiano Healthcare Society, or during the Clinic's afterhours contact the Doctor or Nurse on-call. Depending on the severity of your condition, you may need to be transported off Galiano. In all life-threatening instances, 911 will be called.

#### **SWIMMING**

**Swimming is not allowed during Camp.** No lifeguard is on duty at the Millard Learning Centre or on other beaches on Galiano Island.

### CAMP FORMS

We will ask you to sign a sign safety acknowledgment, media release and registration form before Nature Camp.

## DAY GEAR

- Sturdy 2 strap daypack/backpack
- 1L water bottle
- Sturdy hiking shoes
- Sturdy sandals [Crocs, Keens] water shoes -No Flip Flops!
- o Sun protection [sunscreen, hat, sunglasses]
- Clothes to change into in case you get dirty or wet
- Bathing suit and towel (for water games)
- o Personal medication (EipPen, etc.)
- o Packed lunch for Day 1

- Board games, cards, journal or drawingpad for afterhours/ ferry entertainment

## PLEASE DO NOT BRING

- Personal electronics (the GCA is not responsible for damage or loss of any personal gear)
- · Alcohol or marijuana
- Smoking paraphernalia (cigarettes, vape pens etc.)
- Knives or weapons
